From The Pastor

How do we worship? We bow down before God. We might do that physically by bowing or genuflecting. We also need interior lowliness before God. In church we usually direct our worship to the Holy Eucharist present in the tabernacle. During the consecration of the Mass, the priest repeats the words of Jesus THIS IS MY BODY the change takes place, not in a visible manner but in the truth of what Jesus said. At that moment Jesus is in our midst. He remains present as long as the visible form remains so we keep consecrated hosts in the tabernacle.

Jesus said, "He who eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life." (John 6:54) Our worship is directed not to bread but to Jesus truly present among us. Saint Paul writes, "Whoever, therefore, eats the bread and drinks the cup of the Lord in an unworthy manner will be guilty of profaning the body and blood of the Lord." (1Corinthians 11:27) We would not sin against someone's body and blood if we destroyed a photograph of that person. Jesus accomplished the change of bread and wine to body and blood at the Last Supper, a Jewish observation (Passover) which involved sacrificing a lamb. Jesus was called Lamb of God by John the Baptist.

A visiting missionary, Sr. Zipporah K. Marigwa, a School Sister of Notre Dame (SSND) will speak on July 29-30 at all Liturgies at Holy Trinity and St. Mary's. She is from Kenya in East Africa. She joined SSND in 2001. Sr. Zipporah served four years in Kenya, two years in Ghana, in The Gambia she served for three years, and in Nigeria for two years. Sr. Zipporah has served for 14 years in Africa as an instructor in various elementary school.

Sr. Zipporah is currently a student at Mt. Mary University, doing her Master of Arts in Education as an elementary teacher. She belongs to SSND Province of Africa composed of 76 sisters serving in five countries in Africa. Sixty out of 76 members are African women who have joined the congregation of the School Sisters of Notre Dame.

The contributions received from this appeal will be used for the School Sisters of Notre Dame's missions in African countries where the Sisters serve: The Gambia, Sierra Leone, Ghana, Nigeria, and Kenya. A great need is support for the education and professional training of their African Sisters, as well as the formation of young women joining the Congregation.
