From The Pastor

Picture your KING seated on a chair, a reed in his hand and a crown of thorns upon his head. This is not a picture of power and military might. It is truly an act of love, to endure mockery and pain in order to save the king's subjects from the consequences of sin. Pilate asked Jesus, "Are you a king?" and Jesus replied that He was born for this purpose and those who belong to the truth hear his voice.

Christ is King because as God all things belong to Him. He redeemed people from the dominion of Satan. He is king of angels and the saints in heaven. He rules his kingdom (Church) here on earth. He was recognized as king when the Wise Men arrived and asked, "Where is the newborn king of the Jews?" (Matthew 2:2) On Palm Sunday He entered Jerusalem in procession with people waving branches of palm. Before He rose to heaven at the ascension He proclaimed, "All power in heaven and on earth has been given to me." (Matthew 28:18)

We celebrate the feast of Christ the King by asking Him to guide and rule our families, our homes and ourselves. Christ established a kingdom of service and love, something within the reach of the most humble person. Confirmation gives us anointing to share in Christ's power as priest, prophet and king.

December 2-3 starts the season of Advent. This year we have a short season; use it well to prepare for the coming of the Lord.
